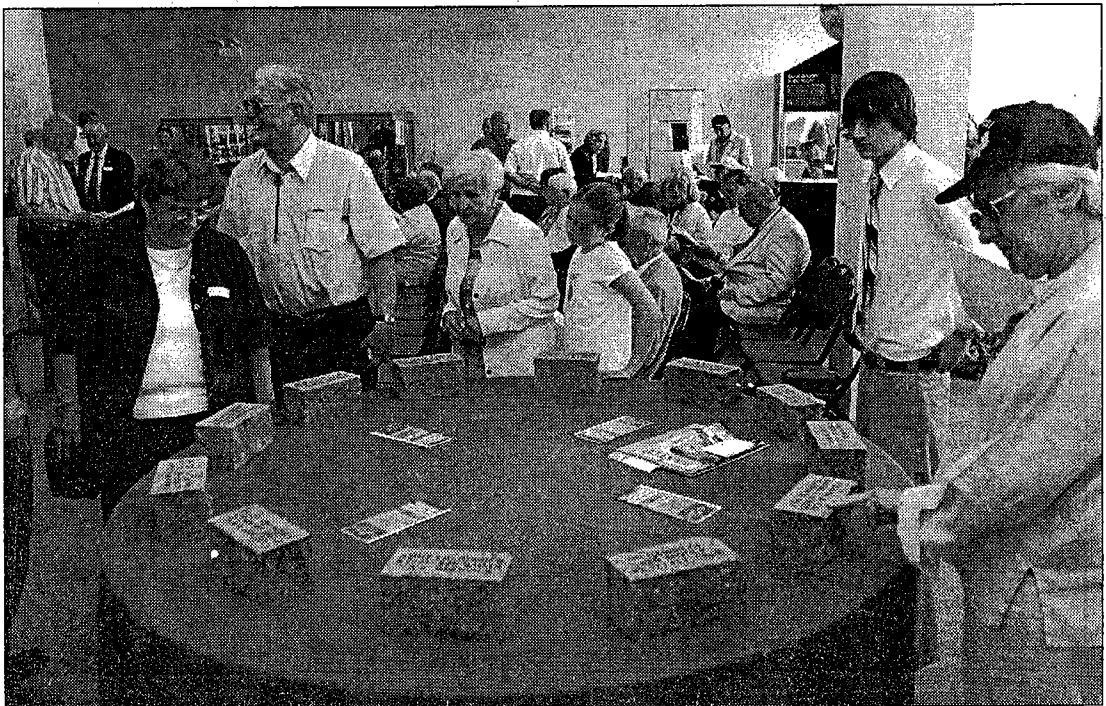
Emotions ran high when about 115 veterans of VA-728 and VA-721 visited the site of what had been the Glenview Naval Air Station, their
